The MFDS examination itself continues to be internationally recognized as a benchmark qualification for dental professionals and is taken by dentists all over the world. We currently run the MFDS Part 1 examination in 12 centres, five of which are outside the UK. The MFDS Part 2 examination was run in both Glasgow and Manchester in 2013.

The Faculty continues to ensure that a premium range of benefits is available to its members and that the highest standards of education, training and examinations are achieved. We pride ourselves on the calibre of our membership. Dental professionals with post nominals from our College are internationally recognized as being of the highest professional standard. It is a stamp of excellence.
